We do find it different to drive everytime we go out. At home we more often walk to the shops, library, school, etc., for the sheer love of the open air, through the woods and the open countryside and up on to the wild moorland near our home.

We can't get used to unlimited free phone calls. At home we try not to make private calls until after 6 p.m. (cheap rate) and during the day we make our calls as brief as possible since we are charged by the minute.

We have tried to slow down our naturally quick way of walking to a saunter and our naturally quick way of talking to a drawl, y'all.

We love the natural courtesy and friendliness of Memphians. We have enjoyed walking 'round this lovely, tranquil, mid-town area with its tree-lined streets and pretty homes with their front porches and swings, so typically southern.

We have community associations similar to VECA, often involved in trying to protect old houses and buildings in the neighborhood, sponsoring clean-up campaigns, and trying to keep neighborhood schools open.
