

# Avoid the High Cost of Winter Heating MLGW Encourages Conservation

Our community, like much of America, endured extreme energy costs this past winter due to the unusual weather and historic increases in wholesale prices. This had such a profound impact across the country, many people are now more eager to conserve energy. Memphis Light, Gas, and Water is taking advantage of this heightened interest by increasing efforts to promote energy conservation in the community. # DRUG DEALERS WHO SELL DRUGS FROM RENTAL PROPERTIES CAN BE EVICTED

The Drug Eviction Program enables you and your neighbors to take an active part in running drug dealers out of your neighborhood. All you have to do is call Crime Stoppers and report the drug selling activity. The call can be anonymous — you do not have to give your name or address.

Crime Stoppers will report the tip to the proper authorities. If it is determined that drugs are being sold from rental property by the tenant or with the tenant's knowledge and cooperation, either the landlord or the D.A.'s office can initiate procedures to get the tenants evicted from that property.

The ultimate goal of the program is to rid neighborhoods of drug activity and make them safer for families to enjoy. We will, of course, criminally prosecute those dealing drugs. At the same time, through the Drug Dealer Eviction Program, we can make sure they don't go right back to the same rental properties continuing to deal in drugs while out on bond.

The District Attorney General hopes that you and your neighbors will take advantage of the program and help them rid the area of any illegal drug sales that may be occurring.

### VECA CDC UPDATE: WATKINS SQUARE
